| <p><b>NEWSPAPER &amp; MAGAZINES</b></p> <p>Newspapers, magazines, catalogs, junk mail, post cards, stationery, tablet paper, white &amp; colored paper, computer paper, business forms, envelopes, folders, coupons, paper bags and phone books.</p>  | <p>Place all paper in brown paper grocery bags</p> <p><b>DO NOT USE STRING OR PLASTIC BAGS.</b></p>   | <p><b>DO NOT INCLUDE:</b><br/>Paper that has been soiled by food or drink, books, napkins, tissue paper, paper towels, wax paper, carbon paper, wrapping paper, blueprint or photographic paper and foam egg containers.</p>            |
| <p><b>CARDBOARD</b></p> <p>Corrugated cardboard &amp; boxboard including shoe boxes, gift boxes, dry food boxes, and cereal boxes (without bags).</p>   | <p>Cardboard must be flattened &amp; placed in paper grocery bags, or under recycling bin. Break down all cardboard boxes into sections no larger than 3' x 3'</p> <p><b>DO NOT USE STRING OR PLASTIC BAGS.</b></p> | <p><b>DO NOT INCLUDE:</b><br/>Soiled cardboard, coated with wax or any other material, any with packing attached, pizza boxes, refrigerated food packaging and any soft drink or beer carton packaging ("wet board").</p>               |
| <p><b>MILK &amp; JUICE CARTONS</b></p> <p>Milk Cartons<br/>Juice Cartons<br/>Drink Boxes<br/>Gable Top Beverage Containers including those with plastic spouts (remove screw-on caps).</p>    | <p>Rinse empty cartons.<br/>Put in recycling bin with other plastic, glass &amp; metal containers.</p>  | <p><b>DO NOT INCLUDE:</b><br/>Straws from drink boxes, frozen food containers, waxed paper or foil drink pouches, caps from beverage container spouts.</p>  |
| <p><b>GLASS BOTTLES &amp; JARS</b></p> <p>All clear, green, and brown food &amp; beverage bottles &amp; jars.</p>   | <p>Wash bottles &amp; jars.<br/>Labels <b>do not</b> have to be removed.<br/>Put containers &amp; metal lids in recycling bin.</p>  | <p><b>DO NOT INCLUDE:</b><br/>Ceramic beer &amp; wine caps, ceramic cups &amp; plates, flower pots, crystal, light bulbs, mirror &amp; window glass, drinking glasses, heat resistant ovenware, eye glasses or hypodermic syringes.</p> |
| <p><b>METAL CANS</b></p> <p>All metal food &amp; beverage cans.<br/><b>EMPTY</b> aerosol cans.<br/>Metal lids, closures &amp; caps.</p>   | <p>Wash cans.<br/>Labels <b>do not</b> have to be removed.<br/>Put containers &amp; lids in recycling bin.</p>  | <p><b>DO NOT INCLUDE:</b><br/>Propane cylinders, silverware, batteries, metal/cardboard containers (frozen juice, oil) small appliances, metal cookware, tin foil, scrap metal or hypodermic syringes.</p>                              |
| <p><b>PLASTIC CONTAINERS</b></p> <p>Plastic food, soap, &amp; beverage small mouth <b>bottles</b> with threaded caps only.<br/>All large mouth containers are <b>now</b> acceptable.</p>    | <p>Wash plastic bottles.<br/>Labels <b>do not</b> have to be removed.<br/>Place bottles in recycling bin.</p>   | <p><b>DO NOT INCLUDE:</b><br/>Do not include <u>motor oil</u> or <u>anti-freeze</u>.</p>  |

**PUT YOUR ORANGE BIN OUT FOR PICKUP BY 7:00 A.M.  
ON YOUR REGULAR GARBAGE DAY.**

**PUT YOUR RECYCLABLES AT LEAST 3 FEET FROM ALL OTHER WASTE.**

**ANY ITEMS NOT LISTED AS RECYCLABLE SHOULD BE INCLUDED WITH YOUR REGULAR GARBAGE.**

# INFORMATION ON OTHER WASTE

(None of the following items should be placed in recycling box)

## TIRES:

Tires must be brought to the Highway Department at 450 Woodward Avenue and will be disposed of for a small fee. The fees are as follows:

| TYPE OF TIRE      | TIRE SIZE                          | CHARGE/TIRE |
|-------------------|------------------------------------|-------------|
| Passenger Car     | 13", 14", 15", 16"                 | \$ 1.50     |
| Light Truck       | 16"—19"                            | 2.00        |
| Large Semi-Trucks | Up to and including 1124.50 series | 5.00        |

Tires on rims will be an additional \$1.00/tire. Any OTR 1125 series or larger will be accepted. **TIRES WILL NOT BE COLLECTED AT YOUR CURB.**

## WASTE OIL, ANTI-FREEZE, PAINT & AUTOMOTIVE BATTERIES:

Put all used motor oil and anti-freeze in a SEALED container separate from the rest of your garbage/trash, and place it at your curb on your regular collection day. Label containers as to contents. **DO NOT MIX OIL AND ANTI-FREEZE.** Empty oil and anti-freeze containers should be included with your regular garbage. Place automotive batteries at your curb on your regular collection day.

**PAINT** should be placed at your curb in its original container, separate from all other garbage/trash.

**WE WILL NOT ACCEPT** gas, gas and oil mix, or any other flammable material, chlorine, also any fungicide, pesticide, acid or any other toxic material.

## ELECTRONICS RECYCLING:

Electronic items (computers, monitors, printers, televisions, etc.) may be placed at your curb on regular collection day for pickup by our Electronics Recycling truck or dropped off at the Highway Department, 450 Woodward Avenue, Monday through Friday 7:00am-4:00pm.

## LARGE APPLIANCES AND SCRAP METAL:

Put appliances and scrap metal at your curb on your regular collection day. Remove all doors from refrigerators and freezers. Metal strips and/or poles must be no longer than 6 feet and tied in bundles no heavier than 60 pounds.

## BRUSH, TREE PARTS, LEAVES, AND SNOW REMOVAL:

Tree branches, shrubs, wood and lumber must be cut and tied into bundles with heavy twine or rope. Bundles cannot exceed 60 pounds in weight and six feet (6') in length. Keep metal separate from wood. Small Christmas trees may be placed at the curb without stands, plastic bags, or ornaments. **Do not plow, blow or shovel leaves or snow into the street. Sidewalks must be kept clear of snow and other debris.**

## BROKEN GLASS AND HYPODERMIC NEEDLES:

**BROKEN GLASS** and other sharp items such as **HYPODERMIC NEEDLES** must be carefully wrapped and placed securely inside a hard plastic container or box, such as a cereal carton, before being placed for collection with your garbage. Large quantities can be placed in a closed container and marked as to contents so your collection crew can take necessary precautions. These items must be included with your regular garbage as specified or they will not be collected. Do not put these items in your recycling bin.

## CONTRACTOR DEBRIS:

Any and all debris resulting from work done by a contractor must be removed by the contractor that did the work. **THE TOWN WILL NOT COLLECT ANY CONTRACTOR DEBRIS.**

## TOWN OF TONAWANDA HOLIDAY SCHEDULE:

Listed below are the holidays that will be observed by the **Town of Tonawanda**. All Town offices will be closed and all garbage, recycling, and trash collections are **ONE DAY LATE** with the exception of Good Friday where collection is that same day. **DO NOT PUT ANY GARBAGE/TRASH AT YOUR CURB MORE THAN 24 HOURS  
PRIOR TO YOUR SCHEDULED COLLECTION**

**ALL EMPTY TOTES AND BINS MUST BE REMOVED FROM YOUR CURB  
BY THE END OF YOUR COLLECTION DAY**
