Our first stop will be a tour of the **Tom Ridge Environmental Center**. This is an educational center at heart, dedicated to teaching visitors about the unique 3,200 acres of Presque Isle and the many different forms of life that inhabit the peninsula. TREC also serves as a center for research, contributing to conservation efforts and promoting environmental awareness, helping to preserve the unparalleled beauty of Presque Isle, the site of Pennsylvania's only seashore.

Then it's off to Erie's most recognized chocolateer, **Pulako's Chocolate** to learn about the process of making candy. Since 1903, Pulako's has made some of the finest chocolates in Erie.

Concourse of **Union Station** is our lunch stop today. Tour the 1927 train station which includes samples of The Brewerie microbrewerie. The Buffet luncheon includes: Garden Tossed Salad, Baked Chicken, Beef Roulade, Mashed Potatoes with Gravy, Green Beans Almondine, Assorted Rolls, Chocolate Cake, Coffee, Tea, and Ice Tea

Then off to **Erie Brewing Company** to learn the process of making beer. Experience how the beer is made from start to finish: from the grain and hops, to the bottling and boxing.

It's now time to set sail on the **Victorian Princess**, an old fashioned paddle boat ride that seats up to 165 people. This narrated cruise of Lake Erie will offer some interesting facts about Erie's Maritime history.
