Always trying to bring new travel opportunities is challenging, which is why this trip is so exciting. Fall foliage in the Finger Lakes has unique scenery around every turn in the road, but dining at a winery perched above Keuka Lake is truly an experience. Legend has it the Iroquois tribe believed the Creator left two handprint signatures here after finishing the world, known as God's Handprint, which formed the eleven Finger Lakes. Unlike the other lakes, Keuka is unique because of its Y-shape, in contrast to the long and narrow other Finger Lakes.



The day starts with lunch at **Bully Hill Winery**. The winery is located on the west side of the lake with spectacular views of the landscape below. The Bully Hill Restaurant features local cuisine, including fresh salads and with a smoker right on the premises, you know you won't want to miss out on the pulled pork.

Today, you will have the option of three meal choices: (iced tea included)

Pulled Pork Sandwich - House-smoked, hand-pulled and served on a freshly baked roll with House BBQ sauce. Served with mixed greens.

Bully Hill Salad - Greens, carrots, red cabbage, sliced apples, dried cranberries, finished with Sweet Walter Rose vinaigrette, topped with sliced chicken.

Angus Cheese Burger - A 100% Black Angus beef patty, topped with American cheese, lettuce and tomato. Served with mixed greens.

The **Glenn H. Curtiss Museum** is home to hundreds of priceless artifacts relating to both early aviation and local history. The Finger Lakes museum features a 750-seat theater, as well as a special events area and gift shop. A restoration shop allows volunteer craftsman the perfect opportunity to learn and build, just as Curtiss once did. Museum visitors will see a full-scale reproduction of the first naval aircraft as well as a 1912 'Pusher,' a 1913 'Model E' flying boat, a 1917 'Jenny,' a 1919 'Seagull' flying boat, and a 1927 'Robin.' Also on display are antique toys, tools, boats, fire equipment, home furnishings, and much more. Curtiss became affixed in the public eye as the foremost aviation pioneer and was later awarded U.S. pilot's license No. 1.
